POSITION SUMMARY

Ontario Health is seeking expressions of interest from laboratory medicine professionals for **membership** on the Ontario Laboratory Medicine Program (OLMP) Microbiology Expert Panel. This is a unique opportunity to provide expertise to drive quality, accountability, and innovation in the laboratory medicine health system. This opportunity is open to all qualified candidates.

The Ontario Laboratory Medicine Program will build upon the framework of the COVID-19 testing network, and with support from the Ministry of Health, will provide strategic and operational coordination and oversight for lab services across the province.

With over 250 million laboratory tests performed in Ontario each year, the OLMP's vision is to enable an integrated testing program across the health system, with laboratory medicine services that are patient-centred, innovative, and ultimately enable the greatest clinical and public health value.

The OLMP's scope of work includes monitoring specimen collection and equitable testing access, leveraging expert advice for appropriate and coordinated laboratory tests, fostering innovation and system responsiveness, enabling digital integration across the testing continuum, and working strategically with health system partners to support point-of-care testing.

Members of the OLMP Microbiology Expert Panel will contribute expert advice and recommendations on the clinical and public health value and validity of new and existing tests or programs in Ontario to support the development, implementation, and evaluation of strategic and operational priorities, together as part of the OH OLMP team, required for integration and transformation of health care services for improved clinical care.

ACCOUNTABILITIES

The key responsibilities of this role are:

1. Provide expertise and insight on system optimization and the delivery of provincial program priorities

- Participate in/contribute to panel meetings and engage with other panel members to drive provincial program priorities, beyond the context of one's individual role.
- Support the development, evaluation, and implementation of Provincial Laboratory Medicine program initiatives
- Review and provide expert input on materials and recommendations brought forward to the committee.

2. Advance knowledge transfer and exchange

- Perform evidence-based reviews, assessments, and provide recommendations for tests and laboratory initiatives, including reviewing input from partners/collaborators and considering the economic impact of testing.
- Contribute to horizon and jurisdictional scanning to enable Ontario's awareness and preparedness for emerging knowledge and clinical practices in the field of laboratory medicine.

3. Enable collaboration and system integration

- Strong collaboration with other programs, initiatives, and subject matter experts related to Laboratory Medicine.
- Establish and maintain effective links with relevant clinical communities on behalf of OH.
- Support and advance collaboration among partners.
 Provide timely advice in response to Ministry, and other requests for information related to the program.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Health professionals (hospital, community-based, and public health laboratories, etc.) currently
 active within Ontario with three to five years of experience in Microbiology.
- Proven track record of experience within health care and/or academic institutions.
- Knowledge of clinical, administrative and system issues with respect to Microbiology in Ontario.
- Aptitude for systems thinking, ability to analyze information and to make sound decisions.
- Enthusiasm for, commitment to, and experience with quality improvement in health care.
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills.
- Highly developed time management skills and ability to prioritize.
- Clinical, research and teaching experience in Microbiology is an asset.
