POSITION SUMMARY

Multi-disciplinary clinician leadership and engagement is foundational to the work of Ontario Health (OH) to advance the delivery of high quality, accessible care. OH is recruiting Regional Clinical Leads including physicians and other qualified healthcare professionals for each OH region, who will work together to advance mental health and addictions priorities at the regional level.

Ontario Health is seeking expressions of interest from qualified mental health and addictions providers for the position of Regional Clinical Lead, Mental Health and Addictions (MHA) [Regulated or Legislated Healthcare Professional, excluding Physicians]. This is a unique opportunity to collaborate with regional stakeholders and provide clinical leadership to the evolution of the MHA system in Ontario. Reporting directly to the Vice President responsible for mental health and addictions in the corresponding OH Region, with indirect reporting and accountability to the Vice President, Clinical, Mental Health and Addictions Centre of Excellence, this role plays an instrumental role in shaping regional MHA delivery systems and implementing regional initiatives aligned to provincial priorities.

Please note that at this time, we are only recruiting for one role at 0.2 FTE (one day/week) in Ontario Health West Region.

ACCOUNTABILITIES

- Provide clinical leadership and advice to support high quality, standardized, regional MHA program development and implementation
- Build consensus among various clinical experts to drive program evolution and adoption in focus areas including/such as depression and anxiety-related disorders, schizophrenia and psychosis, eating disorders, and substance use disorders
- Work with regional leadership and relevant stakeholders to identify and achieve region-specific goals and objectives
- Work with regional partners to drive implementation, monitoring and improvement of regional activities in support of system-level provincial plans and initiatives
- Ensure coordination and integration of care in the region by working with local partners and service delivery organizations, including Ontario Health Teams (OHTs)
- Support targeted regional activities to address issues of capacity, access and flow
- Work with regional stakeholders to increase equitable access to community MHA services and outcomes for vulnerable and marginalized populations and other equity-deserving groups
- Work with regional administrative leadership to ensure there is a strong foundation in place, including a
 Regional Mental Health and Addictions Committee or similar body, to support program development,
 implementation and performance management at the regional level
- Represent OH at key regional and provincial clinical leadership tables, including the Regional Mental Health and Addictions Committee, and lead regional interdisciplinary collaboration to support capacity building
- Participate actively, along with other clinical and administrative leaders, in MHA Centre of Excellence
 Planning and Performance Management Council and Clinical Council to define, guide, monitor and lead
 the development and delivery of coordinated standardized, high quality MHA services
- Work closely with partners in the region to ensure that data, reporting, and digital infrastructure support service providers with monitoring and improvement efforts
- Champion MHA Centre of Excellence Program planning and implementation within the region

QUALIFICATIONS

- Practicing healthcare professional (e.g. nurse, social worker, or other, excluding physicians) who is in good standing and belongs to a profession which falls under the Regulated Health Professions Act or is regulated by other legislation in Ontario
- A minimum of five years of clinical experience in mental health and addictions
- Experience in a leadership role focused on quality and system improvement
- In-depth understanding of Ontario's health care system, with particular focus on the challenges and issues facing MHA access and quality of care in Ontario
- Expert knowledge of current best practices, healthcare literature, and evidence-based guidelines, as it pertains to mental health and addictions care, including depression and anxiety-related disorders schizophrenia and psychosis, eating disorders, or substance use disorders



- Knowledge of health system performance measurement and management approaches, and how this can be used as a tool to promote change
- Aptitude for system thinking and ability to analyse information for sound decision making
- Demonstrated commitment to equitable and person centred care, as well as public accountability
- Excellent communication skills with mature leadership experience in establishing strong relationships and building consensus with partners
- Demonstrated experience in implementation of large-scale change in the health sector
- Demonstrated ability to work with diverse stakeholders to reach consensus
- Given the nature of the role, current experience working in the identified OH Region and within the publicly funded Ontario healthcare system will be considered an asset
