POSITION SUMMARY

Ontario Health is seeking expressions of interest from physicians for the position of **Clinical Lead, Gender-Affirming Care**. This is a unique opportunity to provide strategic leadership to Ontario Health's Emerging Guidelines and Programs team on the development of evidence-based policies and guidance on gender-affirming care, to ensure that such care is delivered in Ontario to eligible gender-diverse adults based on the best available evidence and the highest standards of care.

The Clinical Lead will play a leadership role in the development of products including a guideline review, scoping review, evidence review and recommendations on the delivery of evidence-based gender-affirming care. The Clinical Lead will chair Ontario Health's Expert Panel on Gender-Affirming Surgical Care. The Clinical Lead will champion Ontario Health's initiatives focused on gender-affirming care and ensure that recommendations put forward are based on the best available evidence in the rapidly-evolving field of transition-related surgical care.

This opportunity is open to all qualified candidates.

- Collaborates with Ontario Health staff to provide expert guidance on clinical issues and the development of recommendations for care.
- Establishes and maintains effective links with relevant clinical communities on behalf of Ontario Health.
- Chairs Ontario Health's Expert Panel on Gender-Affirming Surgical Care and other working groups as required
- Responds to clinical questions and represents Ontario Health's work in gender-affirming care in the community, at national meetings, and in the media.
- Identifies and responds to system and project level issues.
- Participates as an active member of Ontario Health's Clinical Council.
- Represents Ontario Health in pan-Canadian working groups related to gender-affirming healthcare

QUALIFICATIONS

- A Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada or the College of Family Physicians of Canada CFPC.
- Holds an independence license with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.
- Clinical experience providing gender-affirming care (including but not limited to counselling, medical therapy, and/or surgical treatment).
- Recognized provincial expertise in the provision of gender-affirming care.
- Knowledge of DSM-5, WPATH and Rainbow Health Ontario's gender-related guidelines.
- Demonstrated evidence of continuing education in relevant fields.
- Experience in leadership positions at provincial, regional and/or local level.
- Ability to analyze and interpret information, make sound decisions and communicate these to clinical and non-clinical audiences.
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills and ability to build consensus.
- Knowledge of current and new/emerging gender-affirming surgical care guidelines.
- Recognition as an opinion leader within the professional community is an asset.
- Experience in population level program design and/or implementation is an asset.
- Models and supports behaviour consistent with the People Values of Ontario Health and a commitment to Ontario Health's Equity, Inclusion, Diversity and Anti-Racism Framework.
